Here's a report from *Fatherly.com* about a backyard or school yard game which children have played from time immemorial: "School districts in Alabama, California, South Carolina and Washington have banned playing tag, explaining to parents that the classic recess game undermines the lessons about consent and boundaries being taught to young students. Whether these bans represent overreach or educational consistency, they raise a question about whether or not the game, in which children chase peers and touch peers who don't want to be touched, has aged well."

Seesaws or teeter-totters are gone. Dodgeball is gone. And now tag is gone. So, just how are kids supposed to get bumps on their heads, welts on their legs and scrapes on their knees these days? Geesh!

I like what Jay Leno had to say about the "tag" brouhaha the same day this news broke concerning a school district in Massachusetts. He wondered about the last kid to get tagged. "You're IT!" And then the game is banned, and this kid is IT for the rest of his life. He's IT. He'll always be IT! Class reunion: "Oh, yeah, I remember you. You're IT."

Here's the thing: I think this is the way a lot of us feel. Whenever we walk into church, we feel like we're "IT." Even in the privacy of our homes, hospital rooms, or nursing home apartments, many of us are still carrying around some stigma, some guilt, something we'd like to lay down. We don't want to be tagged, and we don't want to feel like there's a bull's-eye on our back.

We want to be rid of it.

The good news is that God has removed the IT through Jesus Christ and gave us a U. You're U. You're a person. You are loved, not tagged.

As for being tagged, Jesus was the last one tagged, and now we're all home free. "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine" (Isaiah 43:1).

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
